Dear Parent/Guardian:

Hello! My name is Amy Syversen and I am honored to be the band director at Dayton Oaks Elementary School. Your child attended an assembly where the students had the opportunity to meet me and learn about the Band Program.

I believe children have talent in music in their own special way, and it is my job to help them discover their musical gift. In order to do that, the band students will be taking part in a variety of music activities. These activities will be designed to help the students develop musical skills and to know and appreciate many different styles of music.

Performing in instrumental music ensembles gives students so much more than just musical training. Students learn cooperation and teamwork, commitment and responsibility, tolerance and acceptance, as well as perseverance and self-discipline. Performing with a group that plays well helps build self-esteem, confidence and pride in accomplishment. Studying music also reinforces reading and math skills and enhances gross and fine motor skills.

Please talk with your child about this week's band assembly to see if they have an interest in being a part of this exciting program. The instruments available for students to play will be:

Trombone	Flute	Percussion
Trumpet	French Horn	Saxophone
Clarinet	Baritone	Tuba



These instruments can all be rented or purchased at local music stores. *If you would like to be in band but are unable to rent an instrument please see or contact Mrs. Syversen.* I may receive multiple requests to play some instruments and, therefore, I am asking students to provide their first three choices. In order to maintain small class sizes and proper band balance, not every student will get their first choice instrument. I would also like students to explain briefly why they have chosen their particular first choice instrument. Maybe a sibling or parent has played it in the past, they might like the sound it makes or there may be something about the instrument that makes it special to them. Whatever the reasons, I want them to share those feelings. If a student explains that he or she has an extremely strong desire to play a specific instrument I will do my very best to give that student his or her first choice. I will also work with your child to see if the instrument they have chosen is a good physical match. I will then contact you and let you know which instrument your child will be playing.

Each student will attend band for two thirty-minute sessions per week, but because band will be taught on a rotating schedule, students will only miss the same class/time slot every couple of weeks or so. Classroom teachers are supportive of the band program and provide students with the make up work necessary to keep them on track in other subjects.

Having high expectations and standards gives each student the benefit of enjoyment from their musical experiences. If your child chooses to become a member of the DOES band, he/she will be given a handbook that will explain those expectations and also the policies regarding your child's participation in the band program.

If your child would like to learn to play an instrument and be a part of the fun that comes with being a member of a band, **I ask that they complete the attached sheet and return it to me by Wednesday, September 8th. Band classes will begin on approximately Monday, September 13th.**

I am looking forward to meeting each of you at **on Tuesday, September 21st during our brief Instrumental Music Parent Meeting at 5:00pm in the DOES Cafeteria.** If you have any questions, please contact me at any time!! 1. Wire Music Stand (*for home use, do not bring to school*) – this helps promote good posture and playing position during **home** practice
2. Instrument in good playing condition
3. Metronome (can be purchased for \$15 from a music store or www.wwbw.com)
4. Two pencils with erasers stored in your instrument case
5. Lesson Books:
 - Measures of Success A Comprehensive Musicianship Band Method*
 - Book One for your instrument**
6. 1½ inch 3-ring view binder (with front clear cover for insert)
7. One package of five index divider tabs for the binder labeled with the following sections: (1) schedule/handbook, (2) music, (3) practice charts, (4) scales/rhythm sheets, (5) handouts/other
